

## ADMISSION POLICY FOR NRI AND OVERSEAS STUDENTS

#### International Candidate

International Candidate means a candidate falling under any of the following categories:

- Foreign National (FN)
- Overseas Citizen of India (OCI)
- Person of Indian Origin (PIO)
- Non Resident Indian (NRI)

#### I) Foreign National (FN)

Foreign National shall mean citizens of all countries other than India, who are not of Indian origin as defined under the expression PIO/OCI. An international Candidate holding a foreign passport is eligible to apply as a Foreign Na(onal (FN).

## II) Overseas Citizens of India (OCI)

Overseas Citizens of India: A candidate under this category shall mean a candidate who is granted with Overseas Citizenship of India and has OCI card.

#### III) Person of Indian Origin (PIO)

Persons of Indian Origin (PIO) shall mean the persons who are citizens of other countries who at any (me held an Indian passport, or either of his / her parents or any of his grandparents were a ci(zen of India by virtue of the provisions of the Constitution of India or Sec. 2 (b) of Citizenship Act, 1955 (Act No. 57 of 1955). A candidate is eligible to apply as a Person of Indian Origin (PIO) if he / she have a PIO card.

#### IV) Non Resident Indian (NRI)

Non Resident Indian (NRI) shall mean a person who has not been in India for a period of 730 days or more during the preceding seven years.

#### **Student Visa**

Student visa means a certificate issued or a stamp marked (on applicant's passport) by the immigration authorities of a country to indicate that the applicant's credentials have been verified and he/ she has been granted permission to enter the country for temporary stay for a specified period.

This permission however, is provisional for education purpose and subject to the approval of the Immigration Officer at the entry point. Some countries do not require a visa, as a result of reciprocal arrangements.

The country issuing the visa attaches various conditions to the visa, such as, the (me or period for the validity of visa, whether the visa is valid for one or more than one visits, etc.

The possession of a visa is not in itself a guarantee of entry into the country that issued it, and a visa can be revoked at any time.

#### **Residential Permit**

A valid residential permit means a permit indica(ng the lawful residence in India from the date of arrival onwards, issued to the foreigners at the time of registration by the Foreign Registration Officer under Para 7 of Foreigners Order of 1948. (Not applicable to the Candidates from Nepal and Bhutan)

## Registration at FRO (Foreigner's Registration Office):

All international students must have a valid Student VISA for the dura(on of the course. Students must register with FRO within 14 days of arrival or as per the endorsement on VISA. It is a must to submit a residential Permit for the en(re dura(on of your stay in India.

## **Mandatory Documents**

- C-Form: To be applied online within 24 hours of arrival
- Residence Agreement: Duly signed by you and the Hostel Rector/Owner of the Apartment
- Bonafide Certificate: To be procured from Student Services Dept. of University
- Residence Verification Certificate: To be procured from the Local Police
- Residential Permit: Can be procured online from FRO by submitting necessary documents

## **Admission - Applicable to International Candidates**

#### Provisional admission

It has to be understood that all admissions will be provisional at the time of academic course commencement until the University grants final eligibility and confirms the admission.

#### Confirmation of admission

Every student shall be admitted to NICMAR University, Pune provisionally till the time NICMAR University, Pune confirms the eligibility of the student.

Every student admitted in constituent school of the NICMAR University, Pune shall submit application in prescribed form for eligibility along with requisite documents mentioned in the application to the

School in which he is admitted within the (me limit prescribed for submission. The application and documents shall be checked by concerned school and forwarded to Eligibility Section of the University.

In the case of students migrating from other Board/University the Migration Certificate must be attached with the application for eligibility. If the student is unable to submit migration certificate along

with application for eligibility, the Head of the School may grant him some (me for submission of the same.

The eligibility Section of the university shall scrutinize the application and documents submitted by the students provisionally admitted and confirm admission of the students who fulfill eligibility norms of the University and send the list of such students to the concerned school.

The cases of students who have not submitted migration certificate along with the application for eligibility shall be treated as provisional till the date up to which they have been granted permission to submit the same.

However, if the student fails to submit migration certificate up to the extended date, he / she shall be considered in-eligible for admission and Eligibility Section will inform the Director of the concerned school accordingly and thereby the provisional admission granted to him shall be cancelled by the Director of the School.

The University is the sole authority to grant eligibility for admission to a student and confirm / cancel provisional admission and decision taken by it shall be final.

## **RESERVATION POLICY**

The NICMAR University, Pune has followed the guidelines of State Government of Maharashtra, University Grants Commission to draft it's Reservation Policy.

As per the section 6 / sub-section 2 & 3 the university have adopted the Government policy in regard to the reservation for Scheduled Castes, Scheduled Tribes, De-notified Tribes (Vimukta Jatis), Nomadic Tribes, Other Backward Classes, Special Backward Category and Economically Weaker Section (EWS) for the purpose of admission of students in the university departments and institutions.

The university shall follow the general policy of the State Government in regard to the welfare of various categories of weaker sections of the society and minorities as directed by the State Government, from time to time.

## RESERVED CATEGORY

## **SCHOLARSHIP POLICY**

## **SCHOLARSHIPS & AWARDS**

## **MBA & PGD Programmes**

The University offers "NICMAR University Top Rankers' Scholarship" to the students willing to pursue the full time MBA and PG Diploma programmes. The University also offers "NICMAR University Merit Scholarship" to the full time MBA and PG Diploma students. Students will be eligible for only one award/scholarship for a particular academic semester. Companies that accept students for internship (as applicable) generally offer allowances/stipends during the training period.

#### **NICMAR UNIVERSITY TOP RANKERS' SCHOLARSHIP**

NICMAR University, Pune announces "Top Rankers' Scholarship" for the applicants of full time MBA and PG Diploma programmes. The criteria of Top Rankers' Scholarship for the applicants are as follows:

Applicants can request for NICMAR University Top Rankers' Scholarship according to their marks in class 10th, 12th/Diploma and Graduation at the time of filling the application form for admission. Eligible candidates will get confirmation for the same after verifying their academic records with mark sheets submitted. Eligible applicants need to go through the admission process [Post Graduate NICMAR Common Admission Test (PG-NCAT) / Equivalent Score, Group Discussion (GD) and Personal Interview (PI)]. Selection of candidates is done on the basis of merit. Admission offer letters are issued in the order of merit. The Rating of Application (RA) is calculated on the basis of weighted scores of the cumulative academic performance along with work experience (as applicable) obtained from the documents submitted to the University by the candidates. Selected candidates for the NICMAR University Top Rankers' Scholarship will get offer letter for admission as per their eligibility.

This scholarship will not be offered to any student who postpones his/her admission to University's full time programmes for any reasons whatsoever. Students with scholarship must comply with the following requirements for continuance of scholarship in subsequent academic semesters. Breach of any of these conditions will disqualify the student for the same and will make the student forfeit the scholarship. In such a case, the student will have to pay the necessary fees for the next academic semester. The scholarship will be restored in subsequent semester/s, depending on the fulfilment of the conditions stated below:

- i. The awardees' attendance in any course of study shall not be less than 80%.
- ii. Awardees should pass the semester in the first attempt.
- iii. Semester Performance Index (SPI) should be 8.5 or above.
- iv. The awardees shall have no adverse comments/grading on record from the disciplinary committee for any reason whatsoever.
- No gap/break in semester whatsoever during the entire programme is permissible.

vi. The awardees shall maintain high standards of conduct and behaviour and conform to the discipline of the NICMAR University, as laid down in the 'Code of Conduct' of the NICMAR University.

## **NICMAR UNIVERSITY MERIT SCHOLARSHIP SCHEME**

These rules have been framed by the University, in order to operate and disburse scholarships to the students of the full time MBA and PG Diploma offered by NICMAR University.

Duration : For all academic semesters [except internship (as applicable)].

Number of Scholarships: 10% of students based on merit in each MBA / PGD programme.

#### Criteria and Rules for Award of Scholarships

- i. Scholarships will be awarded on the basis of the Semester Performance Index (SPI) of the concerned academic semester.
- ii. A merit list will be prepared based on the SPI, of 10% students of all the full time MBA / PGD programmes of NICMAR University, Pune, and scholarships will be awarded as detailed in Table 1.
- iii. In case of any tie amongst the candidates on the same SPI, merit will be determined by Cumulative Performance Index (CPI). In case of a tie in CPI, the student securing the maximum number of grade 'AA' followed by the maximum number of grade 'AB' will be given preference. After that, if the tie continues, the scholarship amount will be split evenly amongst the candidates concerned.
- iv. Award of scholarship will be decided after the declaration of each semester end examination results.
- v. The scholarship will be paid after the declaration of the same.

In case of any grievances, the student may apply to the VC, NICMAR University. No appeal will be allowed against the decision of the VC, NICMAR University.

#### Library

The NICMAR University library is designed to support the students, faculty & research scholars. It is a specialized library in the area of Construction Management, Project Management, Real Estate Management and Infrastructure Development. In addition, the library provides knowledge resources in a variety of management & engineering subjects such as: Information Technology, Engineering, Energy, Environment, Social Sciences, all areas of Management, Smart Cities, Entrepreneurship, Architecture, Taxation, Law etc. The Library is the hub of the academic life of the NICMAR University campus. Housed in spacious halls on the first floor of academic block, the library is well stocked with textbooks, technical journals, periodicals and electronic resources. It holds a collection of more than 27000 titles, comprising over 25000 Books, Periodicals, Standards, Cases, Technical Notes, Bound Volumes of Periodicals, Theses and Audio-Visual Materials. It also subscribes to electronic resources which include PROQUEST ABI Inform Complete (9726) Titles), PROQUEST e-Book Central – Business & Engineering (66,697 Books), ASCE Journals (37 Titles), ASCE Proceedings (827 Titles), SCIENCEDIRECT – Business Management & Accounting (119 Journals), TAYLOR & FRANCIS Online (80 Journals), ELSEVIER E-Books (155 Titles), PEARSON E-Books (54 Titles), McGRAW HILL E-Books (35 Titles) and SAGE Journals (22 Titles). Other titles include 'All India Reporter', 'Economic & Political Weekly' and Economic & Business databases of M/s CENTRE FOR MONITORING INDIAN ECONOMY (CMIE) including ProwessIQ, Industry Outlook, Economic Outlook, and the CapEx. It also subscribes to the Antiplagiarism software 'Turnitin – Originality Check' for the faculty.

#### **Health Facilities**

The University Health Centre provides basic medical facility to the students of the University in the form of preventive, curative and promotive health services. A dedicated Medical Officer is available for consultation at fixed hours (1730 hrs to 2030 hrs) daily except Sundays and national holidays however the Medical Officer is also available for emergency consultation outside duty hours. Medicines are to be procured by the residents themselves based on the prescription by the University Medical Officer. The centre has provision for dressing wounds which is being carried out in the dressing room and a two bedded medical emergency rest room is also provided for the residents. Adequate wheels chairs and stretchers are also available in the emergency rest rooms for transporting the resident if the need arises. First aid service is provided at all the sports meets, tournaments and any other meets. Since there are number of hospitals in the near vicinity, ambulance service is provisioned/requisitioned by the hostel staff/residents during emergencies for transporting a patient from residence/health centre to 58e hospital as the case may be.

A medical insurance has been taken out for the residents/day scholars of NICMAR University and covers their medical expenses in case of hospitalization during their period of course.

## **Sports and Cultural Activities**

Students' training at NICMAR University, Pune goes beyond the confines of classroom and curriculum. In order to foster a holistic development of students, the University supports and encourages its students to plan, organise and participate in various co & extracurricular activities. The Student Council represents the general body of students and organises various techno-managerial, sports and cultural events, and celebrates all the major festivals throughout the year, involving the student clubs and student volunteers.

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## **Background**

NICMAR University Pune has been established under State Private Universities Act no XXXVI of 2022 as the 'Self-Financed Specialist Built Environment University of the country with express objectives to provide learning, teaching, capacity, capability and skills development and research and development in higher and technical education of professional disciplines such as Engineering, Technology, Management, Business with an emphasis on Construction, Real Estate, Infrastructure and Project Management (CRIP).

The recent economic reforms undertaken by the Government of India have prompted a change in the policy-making and involving the private sector in the infrastructure development related to higher education. Accordingly, the Government of Maharashtra decided to take great efforts in facilitating private participation to enhance access, excellence, inclusion, and research in the field of higher education in the State by creating best-in-class infrastructure facilities in the State through encouraging the formation of self-financed universities in the State. This was done to ensure the highest standards and quality of higher education, to meet the needs of the students under the ever-changing academic and economic scenario, and to create confidence in the minds of the public.

Academic research is well recognized as an effective way for universities to disseminate their knowledge and expertise. The provision of academic research can make an early and direct impact on society.

## Section I: Guidance for undertaking Research

# 1. Purpose of Policy

This policy is formulated with an aim to realise the vision and mission of the NICMAR University to provide access to educational programs responsive to evolving industry and societal needs through outstanding learning and teaching, research and a culture of enterprise.

This document sets out clear guidelines within which research activity can be undertaken by University faculty, how the University will support and reward faculty that engage in research and how this activity will be developed and managed by the University Research and Development Cell (RDC).

This purpose of this policy is to provides important guidelines, processes to be followed, the layout of research incentive schemes, and university-level research ethics practices to be followed.

This policy aims to provide provisions for research to ensure that the teaching and research connection is maintained. This policy prescribes that research, invention, and innovation form a necessary and significant part of the functions of a higher education institution.

This research policy serves as a guide to all academic staff to understand the systems and processes which have been developed for the effective implementation of research grant/incentives application, evaluation, and approval, and also to provide unique and substantial research support in encouraging continuous research.

## 2. Objectives

The objectives of the research policy are to:

- Encourage dynamic involvement of academic and research staff of the university in research activities.
- Improve university-level researcher output through a collaborative research environment.

Transform knowledge into products, processes, services, or solutions that add value for socio-economic benefit in the CRIP (Construction, Real Estate, Infrastructure, and Project) sector.

Promote collaboration and active engagement through research activities with local, national, and global partners including industries, businesses, government agencies, private companies, professional bodies, educational establishments, and the community.

Ignite a passion for inventions, innovations, and the design of new knowledge for the benefit of society.

#### 3. Terms and definitions

The following terms have been used in this research policy with specific meanings as below:

**Patent:** Granted for a new, useful research invention that gives the patent holder a right to prevent others from using the invention without a license from the inventor for a certain period.

**Royalty:** Payment made for a concession of commercial value or to the owner of a copyright, patent, trademark, or know-how for its use.

**Copyright:** The exclusive right to control reproduction or adaptation of such works for a certain period.

## 4. Research Policy Statements

#### 4.1 Research Areas

Research areas are the research clusters in line with NICMAR University's operation focus. In the context of support and available resources, the focus of decision-making in identifying research areas significantly lies with the faculty members where the knowledge of available resources and expertise reside. The university encourages faculty members to be selective in the areas of research and to utilize the resources available most productively and effectively.

## **4.2** Funding for paper presentations at Conferences

NICMAR University faculty members are entitled for availing of financial and leave support as follows:

## **4.2.1** Paper Presentation in National Conferences

During an academic year, faculty members can apply for financial and leave support for paper presentations at two conferences in India. The food and lodging expenses will be as per the per-diem rule of the university. Travel expenses will be reimbursed on an actual expense basis subject to the travel policy of the university as per the faculty member's grade/designation. The registration fee for the conference will be paid in actual, subject to the maximum limit of Rs. 10,000.

#### **4.2.2** Paper Presentation in International Conference

In every 3 years block, faculty members are entitled to financial and leave support for paper presentations in one conference outside India. But, faculty members in the probation period will not be eligible for this. The request will be subject to the alignment and outcome of the research/paper with the agreed objectives and timeline in the PDR. The food and lodging expenses will be as per the per-diem rule of the university. Travel expenses will be reimbursed on an actual expense basis subject to the travel policy of the university as per the faculty member's grade/designation. The registration fee for the conference will be paid on an actual basis, subject to a maximum limit of Rs. 40,000.

#### 4.3 Honorarium for Research Publications

To promote research culture and quality publications, NICMAR University will incentivise the faculty members for their research paper publications as per the table given below:

Note 2: The honorarium mentioned above is for each paper published and will be equally divided among authors. The criteria of the category of publication (FT50/ABDC/ABS/SJR) will be considered based on the date of publication. A list of ABDC, FT50, and ABS will be circulated to faculty members by the University research department periodically. In case any journal is listed in both Table I ranking and Table II ranking, higher honorarium eligibility of the two will be considered for the payment.

Note 3: The honorarium is subject to annual revision based on the outcomes of the previous years.

Note 4: Faculty members can claim the honorarium for publication after the generation of DOI (Digital Object Identifier) of their accepted papers.

#### **4.4** Working Credit for Research Paper Publications and Conference Presentations

NICMAR University will give working credit (Hourly) to the faculty members against the target of research paper publications in accordance with **NICMAR University Workload policy.** 

## 5. NICMAR University Research Code of Conduct

NICMAR University is committed to the highest standard of conduct in research work adhering to the following principles:

- **Integrity:** Researchers regardless of academic disciplines are expected to uphold research integrity at all times.
- Accountability: Researchers are accountable to society, their profession, the communities and institutions where the research is taking place, the staff and students involved, and to sponsoring bodies that are funding the research.
- **Professional Guidelines and Legal Requirements:** Researchers should observe standards of practice set out in guidelines published by funding bodies, scientific societies, and other related professional bodies.
- **Openness:** Institute encourages researchers to be as open as possible in disseminating the work to other researchers and the public.
- Ethics: The research and data collection should be done ethically. If data collection has been done from the faculty members or students of the university as the respondents, approval must be taken from the appropriate committee of the University. Each respondent/survey participant must be communicated fairly about the purpose of the survey/responses/research. Each researcher should conform to University Research Ethics Policy.

## 6. Intellectual Property and Royalty

All outcomes of research activities including patent, copyright, and royalty are subject to the terms and conditions as stipulated in the **NICMAR University Intellectual Property Policy**.

#### 7. Permission Requirements for Research Engagements

NICMAR University encourages academic and research collaborations and hence, the requirements of approval from the competent authority for the paper review invitations, thesis evaluation invitation (Ph.D./Master/U.G.), editorial positions, research collaboration within or outside the university, and joint-authorship is not required. However, all such activities must be aligned with the institute's goals and research intent. A letter of advance information of all such activities are desired to submit to Dean-Research & Ph.D. Programmes office. Any query regarding the nature of the engagements and requirement of approval must be channelized through Dean-Research & Ph.D. programmes.

#### 8. Research Support for Faculty

#### 8.1 Early Career Research Grant (Seed Money Scheme)

Seed Money Scheme (SMS), sponsored by NICMAR University aims to promote research and innovation amongst young faculty. The objective of the seed funding scheme is to enhance the possibility of securing external project funding. The projects are expected to lead to a substantial bid for external funding to take this work forward subsequently. One time seed fund of Rs. 2,00,000 will be awarded to the recipients. This research project should be completed in a time frame of less than 18 months.

The seed money is expected to be spent on the following items:

- a. Equipment/software/related to the proposal (which are not available at NICMAR University).
- b. Contingencies (books, stationaries, etc).
- c. Any other important items subject to the prior approval of the Vice-Chancellor through Dean-Research & Ph.D. Programmes.

However, the grant can't be used for the purchase of a laptop/desktop, taking membership in any professional bodies, or travel/registration to attend conferences.

Eligibility:

- a. A Early Career Faculty means those faculty members who are in the position of assistant professor and have joined the institute in the last 3 years.
- b. The applicant must be a doctorate. Non-doctorate applicants must demonstrate that they have undertaken research at an equivalent level.
- c. An application can be submitted as an individual or in a group of not more than 4 members. In the case of a group proposal, all applicants must be young faculty members.
- d. One applicant can't submit more than one application in the same academic year.

Note: Assets purchased using this seed money scheme will be the property of the University and hence, in no way the recipients of the scheme should claim these assets.

## **8.2 Mid-Career Research Grant (Seed Money Scheme)**

Seed Money Scheme (SMS), sponsored by NICMAR University aims to promote research and innovation amongst mid-career faculty members also. The objective of the seed funding scheme is to enhance the possibility of securing external project funding. One time grant of Rs. 5,00,000 will be awarded to the recipients. This research project should be completed in a time frame of less than 1 year. The grant money is expected to be spent on the following items:

- a. Equipment/software/related to the proposal (which are not available at NICMAR University).
- b. Contingencies (books, stationaries, etc).
- c. Engage research assistant(s)/staff(s) on the research project.
- d. Any other important items subject to the prior approval of the Dean- Research & Ph.D. Programmes.

However, the grant can't be used for the purchase of a laptop/desktop, taking membership in any professional bodies, or travel/registration to attend conferences.

## Eligibility:

- a. The mid-career faculty means those faculty members who are in the position of associate professor and have joined the institute in the last 5 years or been promoted to Associate Professor in the last 5 years.
- b. The applicant shouldn't have received the Early Career Research grant in the last 5 years.
- c. An application can be submitted as an individual or in a group of not more than 4 members. In the case of a group proposal, all applicants must be mid-career faculty members.

d. One applicant can't submit more than one application in the same academic year.

Note: Assets purchased using this seed money scheme will be the property of the University and hence, in no way the recipients of the scheme should claim these assets.

# 8.3 Vice-Chancellor's Challenge Grant

NICMAR university is committed to promoting interdisciplinary research. The Vice-Chancellor's Challenge Grant is an initiative to enable faculty members to go beyond their academic discipline and collaborate with faculties of other departments and disciplines and develop exciting new research. The objective of this collaboration should be to extend the proposal and look for substantial external funding. One time grant of Rs. 10,00,000 will be awarded to the recipient. This research project should be completed in a time frame of less than 1 year.

The grant money is expected to be spent on the following items:

- a. Equipment/software/related to the proposal (which are not available at NICMAR University).
- b. Contingencies (books, stationaries, etc).
- c. Engage research assistant(s)/staff(s) on the research project.
- d. Any other important items subject to the prior approval of the Dean, Research & Publications.

However, the grant can't be used for the purchase of a laptop/desktop, taking membership in any professional bodies, or travel/registration to attend conferences.

#### Eligibility:

- a. A group of not more than 5 faculty members. Faculty members must be from at least two different departments. The team must reflect an interdisciplinary research focus. Faculty members can be from any academic position but must be a doctorate.
- b. The applicant shouldn't have received the Early Career Research grant and/ or Mid-career research grant in the last 5 years.
- c. One applicant can't submit more than one application in the same academic year.

Note: Assets purchased using this seed money scheme will be the property of the University and hence, in no way the recipients of the scheme should claim these assets.

## Section II: Guidance for undertaking institutional consultancy

## 9. Purpose of Policy

Consultancy is an important channel through which knowledge and expertise could flow from university to businesses and other external agencies, and it can contribute to the growth, development, and productive relationship with society. Expert professional advice/testing services offered by individual faculty/ team of faculty to the external agencies Government/Semi-Government/Private are defined as Consultancy Activity. Consultancy activity may be associated with contractual relationships, including research, service contracts, etc. with government and non-government organizations. The Institute is committed to supporting faculty in external engagements that facilitate knowledge and technology transfer contributing to economic and social impact. There could be several external engagements in multiple forms but this policy defines which of them would be considered a "consulting" activity.

Consultancy areas are expected to be in line with NICMAR University's operational fields, i.e., Construction, Real Estate, Infrastructure, and Projects (CRIP). The focus will be on feasibility studies, financial analysis, human resource management, international construction, contracting, productivity, methodology development, project management, quality and safety management, techno-economic studies, project development, project planning, smart cities, technology development, real estate related issues and developments, etc. These areas are just indicative and faculty members are encouraged to provide consultancy services to the subject of interest as required by the clients in the CRIP segment.

#### 10. Objectives

The objectives of the consultancy policy are to:

- Encourage faculty members to work in tandem and provide innovative solutions to the industry.
- Improve industry connect of the university and establish the university as the hub of cutting-edge solution providers.
- Explore the possibility of research and patents from the offered consultancy services.

• Create an environment of active solution providers to the industry in the university by sharing the issues and solutions among peer groups and students through various modes.

#### 11. Definitions and Scope

Consultancy is a service provided by the members of the university in their field of expertise to clients outside the institution for some financial consideration. The consultancy will produce some form of contracted output which may be partly or wholly owned by the client. It will be governed by short-term contracts while making minimal use of the university resources. It would be an additional management responsibility for the university and would involve extra work for existing university staff. Therefore, the university will charge a part of the consultancy fee from the member of the university who is engaged in consultancy. Consultancy for organizations owned by a faculty or staff or an organization in which a faculty or staff may have interest or stake is also included within the scope of this policy document.

#### 12. Roles and Responsibilities

Dean - Research and Ph.D. Programmes will facilitate the following:

- To set out direction and strategies of consultancy activities in the faculty.
- To evaluate and give recommendations for the consultancy proposals.
- To promote consultancy activities in the faculty community.
- To recommend the final approval of the consultancy from the Vice-Chancellor (VC),
   NICMAR University.

## 13. Duration of Consultancy

- The total time invested in consultancy activity must be less than 30 working days or equivalents per academic year.
- The duration of any consultancy activity will be limited to that mentioned in the approved agreement.
- Any extension of consultancy work would require prior permission of the Vice Chancellor (VC), NICMAR University through Dean-Research and Ph.D. Programmes.

## 14. Approval of Consultancy Activity

All consultancy proposals have to be submitted to the Vice Chancellor, NICMAR University through Dean - Research and Ph.D. Programmes, who will have the right to decide whether to accept or decline the proposal.

University will adopt costing model for bidding the consultancy project and all project costing need to be agreed with Dean-Research & Ph.D. Programmes office before submitting to the clients.

#### 15. Conflict of Interest

- Engagement in consultancies must not create any perceived or actual conflict of interest.
- Conflict of interest, if any, must be immediately reported to the Vice Chancellor, NICMAR University through Dean Research and Ph.D. Programmes.
- A conflict of interest shall be considered as a case where an employee engages in consultancy at the expense of the interests of the institute as defined by NICMAR University.

#### 16. Income Distribution and other Guidelines

- The university will retain 30% of the gross consultancy value (gross income).
- If the university incurs a cost for allowing the consultancy, it will be deducted by the university from the gross income earned through the consultancy before splitting the net income between the consultancy provider (faculty) and the university. This will be over and above the 30% share as defined in the previous point.
- If the university doesn't incur any cost, the faculty member/s providing consultancy would be entitled to retain 70% of the share. This amount can be used to meet all the execution cost requirements.
- If a faculty/staff member is involved in consultancy services for more than 10 working days in total, the salary component of faculty/staff will be charged from the faculty share for the number of days beyond 10 days.
- The faculty member/s providing consultancy will pay the amount against the salary of faculty and staff to the institute in and above the 30% share, as and when applicable.
- The income earned by any individual from consultancy will be taxable as per Govt. of India rules.

- All financial transactions related to the consultancy must be cashless through bank transfers to/from the appropriate university account. No transactions should be carried out through personal accounts.
- The time spent on consultancy services will not be considered in the work-load management system.

#### 17. Code of Conduct

- The conduct of the employee during the consultancy work must conform to the prestige and reputation of the university. The university will be entitled to take disciplinary action against its employee for any misconduct during the consultancy.
- Original copies of all documents related to all consultancy services undertaken by its employee must be in the possession of the university for allowing appropriate processing for financial accounting and audit purposes.

## 18. Dispute Redressal and Resolution

All cases of lack of clarity on any issue, ambiguity, or subjectivity in interpretation, must be reported to the Vice Chancellor, NICMAR University, through Dean - Research and Ph.D. Programmes, whose decision will be final and binding. The Vice-Chancellor may, at any point in time, call for amendment or revision of this policy document as deemed appropriate.
