## **INTRODUCTION**

Projects are undertaken in the public and private sectors to meet the economic needs of industry and society. It offers immense potential for project business all over the world. Managing projects of large scale is a vital key to successful project delivery in a variety of sectors. Achieving excellence and innovations in the infrastructure, industrial, financial and service sectors requires skills and sound knowledge of advanced project management theory and practice.

The focus of the programme is on large and complex engineering and non-engineering projects, which require specialised human resources. Competent project professionals are required to manage and lead the project successfully. The programme adopts a multidisciplinary approach comprising project management and systems engineering so that budding project managers are prepared to work in different sectors of the industry. Industryready project professionals are employed in oil and gas, software development, manufacturing, energy, infrastructure and construction including clients, contracting and consulting organisations. Such trained manpower is also required by various organisations for education, health care and management of rural projects. The MBA APM addresses the techno-managerial needs of various projects in different sectors of the industry. - To train students so that they can acquire proficiency in the management of projects in different sectors.
- To develop students' skills in financial, marketing, human resource, operations and supply chain related aspects of project management.
- To provide key techniques for management and leadership of projects with emphasis on various aspects of project management e.g. planning, quality, time, costs, risk management, software and information technology.

## **PROGRAMME HIGHLIGHTS**

This programme is based on the concepts and practices of project management and combines subject knowledge with related practices.

The first-year curriculum includes various General Core and Programme Core courses to improve students' understanding of key aspects in business management applicable for managing projects. During the second year, General Electives, Programme Electives and Domain Electives are offered to develop in-depth knowledge of project management in different sectors and domains. Practical experience is also gained by the students through site visits and summer internships. Project work under the supervision of a faculty guide, develops skills in scientific analysis of problems and report writing. Computer application skills along with knowledge of quantitative methods create an analytical edge for managerial decision making that is vital for managing complex projects. The students are trained on a suite of software required for project management and analysis.

## **DURATION AND ORGANISATION**

The duration of the programme is of two years. It is conducted in four semesters with suitable breaks. Semesters I, II, III and IV are devoted to classroom learning, acquiring hands-on experience in software, managerial skills, research techniques and presentation skills. Summer internship is scheduled after Semester II and then electives are covered in Semester III and Semester IV.

## ELIGIBILITY

Candidates with bachelor's degree from a recognized Institution / University are eligible. Candidates seeking admission are required to have secured minimum 50% aggregate marks at graduation level. Final year eligible graduating students can also apply. However, such candidates must have completed (passed) their Graduation before the commencement of programme.

## NUCS HYDERABAD ADMISSION PROCEDURE

Selection of students is made by the selection committee. Those interested in admission to the various programmes offered by the NUCS may apply online, pay fees and upload documents through the website: <https://www.nicmar.ac.in/hyderabad> or direct link: <https://admission.nicmar.ac.in/admissionhyd/> <https://admission1.nicmar.ac.in/admissionhyd/>.

Applications are scrutinized and eligibility is established on the basis of the documents submitted. Eligible candidates will be invited to appear for the selection procedure, which comprises Valid score of MAT/CAT/ATMA/PG-TSCET/PG-APCET/PG-KSCE, Group Discussion (GD), Personal Interview (PI) and Rating of Application (RA). The details are as follows:

### Mode of Selection Process

Shortlisted candidates will be called for Group Discussion (GD) and Personal Interview (PI). GD & PI would also be conducted online. Candidates can attend online GD and PI from their residence or any suitable place as per their convenience.

The RA is calculated on the basis of weighted scores of the cumulative academic performance along with work experience (wherever applicable) obtained from the documents submitted to NUCS by the candidates. Selection of candidates is done on the basis of merit. The merit list is drawn on the basis of performance in MAT/CAT/ATMA etc. exam, GD, PI and RA. Admission offer letters are issued in the order of merit. Candidates' preference of programme will be considered, but the allotment will be done at the sole discretion of the admission department, NUCS. Candidates should appear for the selection procedure on the given dates.

## DOMICILE

Out of the total approved intake capacity, twenty five percent of the seats are reserved for the students having domiciled in the State of Telangana.

## FINANCIAL ASSISTANCE

NUCS offers “**NUCS Top Rankers' Scholarship**” to the students willing to pursue the full time PG programmes.. The Institute also offers **NUCS Merit Scholarship**” to the full time PGP students. Students will be eligible for only one award/scholarship for a particular academic semester.

## NUCS Top Rankers' Scholarship

NICMAR announces 'Top Rankers' Scholarship' for the applicants of full PGP programmes. The criteria of Top Rankers' Scholarship for the applicants are as follows:

Applicants can request for NICMAR Top Rankers' Scholarship according to their marks in class 10th, 12th/Diploma and Graduation at the time of filling the application form for admission. Eligible candidates will get confirmation for the same after verifying their academic records with mark sheets submitted. Eligible applicants need to go through the admission process [Post Graduate NICMAR Common Admission Test (PGNCAT), Group Discussion (GD) and Personal Interview (PI)]. Selection of candidates is done on the basis of merit. The merit list is drawn on the basis of performance in PG-NCAT, GD, PI, and Rating of Application (RA). Admission offer letters are issued in the order of merit. The RA is calculated on the basis of weighted scores of the cumulative academic performance along with work experience (as applicable) obtained from the documents submitted by the candidates. Selected candidates for the NICMAR Top Rankers' Scholarship will get offer letter for admission as per their eligibility.

This scholarship will not be offered to any student who postpones his/her admission for any reasons whatsoever. Students with scholarship must comply with the following requirements for continuance of scholarship in subsequent academic semesters. Breach of any of these conditions will disqualify the student for the same and will make the student forfeit the scholarship. In such a case, the student will have to pay the necessary fees for the next academic semester. The scholarship will be restored in subsequent semester/s, depending on the fulfilment of the conditions stated below:

- i. The awardees' average attendance in any course of study shall not be less than 80%. ii. Awardees should pass the semester in the first attempt.
- iii For the restoration of Hyderabad Top Ranker's Scholarship, the awardee must have minimum SPI as per below table.

## NUCS Merit Scholarship Scheme

These rules have been framed by the Institute, in order to operate and disburse scholarships to the students of the full time PGP programmes offered by NUCS.

- Duration : For all academic semesters.  
 Number of Scholarships : 10% students of each programmes.

## Criteria and Rules for Award of Scholarships

- I. Scholarships will be awarded on the basis of Semester Performance Index (SPI) of the concerned academic semester.
- II. A merit list will be prepared based on the SPI. Scholarships will be awarded to top 10% students of all.
- III. In case of any tie amongst the candidates on the same SPI, merit will be determined on the basis of Cumulative Performance Index (CPI). In case of a tie in CPI, the student securing the maximum number of grade 'AA' followed by the maximum number of grade 'AB' will be given preference. After that, if the tie continues, the scholarship amount will be split evenly amongst the candidates concerned.
- IV. Award of scholarship will be decided after the declaration of each semester end examination results.
- V. The scholarship will be paid after the declaration of the results.
- VI. The awardees of the scholarship may be assigned academic work of such nature and duration as may be decided by the Programme Head concerned, keeping in mind the overall need to keep such assigned work to a minimum level possible.

### ADMISSION UNDER MANAGEMENT QUOTA

The NUCS has the policy of admitting a limited number of students under the management quota, not exceeding 5% of the total students admitted.

Candidates to be considered for admission under the management quota must fulfil the following requirements:

Satisfy all the eligibility criteria for admission to the respective full time programmes of the NUCS as mentioned on the website.

Must have appeared for the admission process of the NUCS including Post Graduate NUCS Common Admission Test (PG-NCAT), Group Discussion (GD) and Personal Interview (PI).

On selection, should be ready to pay the tuition fee, which will be 50% higher than the regular tuition fee for the respective programme.

All students who would successfully complete the programme under this quota will also be eligible for on-campus placement assistance for final job placement

### **Note: Hostel and mess charges are additional.**

The tuition fee includes classroom teaching, workshops as per the programme structure and other charges i.e. fees for examinations, evaluation, project work and assessments, library and students' welfare fund. NUCS, Hyderabad provides a free group accident insurance and group Mediclaim policy that covers all students.

The admission fee (Rs. 5,000/-) is non-refundable and non-transferable under any circumstances. The security deposit (Rs. 10,000/-) is refundable on completion of the programme (after adjustment of dues, if any from the student).

The following conditions apply for the payment of fees and other dues.

#### **For 1<sup>st</sup> Instalment (at the time of admission):**

- The fees and other dues payable at the time of admission are as mentioned in the admission offer letter.

#### **For 2<sup>nd</sup> Instalment Onwards:**

- Fees are payable as per the notification given to the students by the department concerned.
- The fees are payable as per the schedule given, failing which, fees paid after this schedule will be subject to a late fine of Rs.100/- per day(including GST) will be payable for the first seven days after which the fine will be Rs 250/ -(including GST) per day.

**The NUCS, Hyderabad reserves the right to revise any/all of the components of the above policy, including payment schedule and refund policy without any prior notice.**

## **POLICY FOR CANCELLATION OF ADMISSION AND REFUND OF FEE**

NUCS has a policy of considering refund of the first instalment of tuition fee paid by the student at the time of acceptance of offer, against cancellation of admission. The Institute strictly follows UGC guidelines in respect of refund of fees. All request applications duly signed by the student must necessarily be received by the Head Admissions. All such requests in writing must be sent by hand/post/courier only. Any request for refund by e-mail/telephone/fax, etc. if not accompanied by a formal request in writing in the hard copy format within the time stipulated below will not be considered.

If a student chooses to withdraw from the programme of study in which he/she is enrolled, NUCS, Hyderabad shall follow the following five-tier system for the refund of fees remitted by the student. The security deposit shall be refunded in full.

However, NUCS, Hyderabad will not refund the admission fee of Rs. 5,000/- paid by the student, under any circumstances.

No refund of fees will be admissible for any cancellation request received on 16th September, 2024 onwards. In case, the student applies for cancellation after the deadline mentioned above, NUCS, Hyderabad will refund the security deposit of Rs. 10,000/- only (after adjustment of dues, if any from the student).

## **HOSTEL AND LIVING EXPENSES**

Hostel accommodation is available at NUCS Hyderabad (Shamirpet) Campus. Girl students granted admission are housed separately. All students have to abide by the Code of Conduct issued by the Institute.

The hostel accommodation within the campus is allotted purely on first come, first served basis.

This campus has four hostels which can accommodate 824 boys (in 412 rooms on twin sharing basis) and 140 girls (in 70 rooms on twin sharing basis).

Shared occupancy in campus Rs. 5,000 per month +12 % GST  
 Single occupancy in a two-bedded room (if available) Rs. 6,600 per month + 12%GST  
 Mess Fee is **Rs. 350/- per head per day** (Including GST). The food package includes breakfast with tea, buffet lunch, evening snacks with tea and buffet dinner.

All programmes at Hyderabad (Shamirpet) campus are fully residential and students have to compulsorily reside in the hostels. However, the Institute can assist the students in exploring accommodation in private hostels outside, if the above capacity is exceeded.

### Payment Schedule

Hostel and mess fees are payable term-wise within 7 days of the commencement of the term. In case of delay, a fine of Rs. 75/- per day will be payable for the first 7 days, after which, the fine will be Rs. 125/- per day. The hostel and food fees once paid are non-refundable or non-transferable. Mess facility is mandatory for all students staying in NUCS hostels.

Typically, the total living expenses including hostel, food and any other expenses at Hyderabad (Shamirpet) are approximately Rs. 15,000/- to Rs. 18,000/- per month.

Note: Hostel Accommodation and Food charges are inclusive of all taxes applicable.

In case of a tie in CPI, the student securing the maximum number of grade 'O' followed by the maximum number of grade 'A' will be given preference. ## ACADEMIC REQUIREMENTS

The curriculum for MBA Advanced Project Management is organised into four semesters (2 Years). In each semester, students are exposed to a variety of theory courses and practicals meant for hands-on practical training. The semester-wise distribution of courses and workshops is given in Table 2 and Table 3 with programme details. **i. Courses**

Courses may be of two or three credits depending upon the requirement for effective coverage. Different pedagogical tools are used to make the course interesting and useful.

### **a. General Core (GC)**

These are the courses drawn from General Management area and are intended to provide students with transferable insights to offer a "generalist's view" that may be useful in managing complex projects.

### **b. Programme Core (PC)**

These are the courses that are specific to Project Management area and provide students with an in-depth understanding of concepts and tools that are vital for managing projects across their life cycles. State of art project management software is also included in the curriculum.

**c. General Elective (GE)**

These courses are intended to provide a detailed understanding of courses belonging to other Schools and offer a multi-disciplinary approach to managing projects. The diverse schools in the NUCS, Hyderabad make it possible to offer these electives.

**d. Programme Elective (PE)**

These electives are designed to provide an in-depth understanding of project management in different contexts such as global, digital transformations and advances in the area of project management.

**e. Domain Elective (DE)**

Domain-specific courses provide deep insights in project management in different domains such as MEP, Oil and Gas, IT, NPD, BIM, Energy, Rural, Education and Healthcare.

**ii. Practical**

Exercises in the form of practical's provide an opportunity to the students to learn through practice and it forms an integral part of the academic learning of the students. A variety of practical's are conducted to develop relevant skills important to manage projects efficiently.

**a. Computer Practice Laboratory (CPL)**

Computer Practice Laboratories integrate information technology and software applications relevant to various management functions. The software used in projects worldwide such as MSP, Oracle Primavera, Palisade @Risk, BIM, Lynx, Candy, Microsoft Dynamics and SPSS are practiced during the laboratory sessions. Efficient and creative application of IT tools is the USP of NUCS, Hyderabad.

**b. Managerial Skills (Mandatory Non-Graded, Non-credit)**

Managerial Skills workshops are an important part of the curriculum. These workshops equip students with managerial communication, presentation, team management, career management and other soft skills. They gain hands-on practical experience so as to acquire the following skills.

- Managerial communication and people skills.
- Cross-cultural communication and communication at work.
- Interview skills, group discussion and career development skills.

Team management, negotiation, problem solving and other essential soft skills

Group assignments, audio-visual presentations, role-plays, group discussions, language lab sessions and case studies are some of the elements of the pedagogy used for these workshops. Students are trained in Business English through Orel Digital Language Lab, interactive language learning software. It enhances communication skills of students and enables them to communicate confidently.

NUCS, Hyderabad organises visits to various project sites. Attendance is compulsory for these visits. Students are encouraged to take the initiative in organising these visits. Students pay for their expenses on tours. NUCS, Hyderabad provides them with the bus facility for site visits.

**iii. Project Work**

Project Work is an independent and individual requirement that consists of 10 credits. The student is expected to select a live problem in the industry or a major issue impacting the performance of projects. The topic should be researchable in the given time period and approved by the NUCS. This should include a description of the problem

statement, review of the literature, scientific design of the study, collection and analysis of data and preparing a project report in an acceptable academic style. The student will be allotted a guide by the NUCS. If the student chooses to have a guide from outside, NUCS, Hyderabad will nominate one of the internal faculty members as a co-guide. Following are the major components of the project work: **a. Project Seminar**

Students are required to conceptualise a research idea for further study on it at the beginning of the third semester. The student makes a presentation of the work in the form of a seminar.

#### **b. Project Work (Submission and Viva Voce)**

In the fourth semester, the student completes data analysis and submits the thesis for final evaluation.

#### **iv. Summer Internship**

As part of the curriculum, each student undergoes supervised field training with a reputed project firm for 8 to 10 weeks. During this period, they may be trained in project management practices such as planning, execution, progress assessment, site management, reporting etc. While the training is on-the-job, the student is expected to perform certain regular duties on the project as may be felt fit by the concerned organisation.

Organisations for practical training are carefully selected from amongst reputed firms. Based on their performance, students may receive a Pre-Placement Offer (PPO). Essentially, NUCS, Hyderabad looks for meaningful and supervised work experience for the students. Students may also opt for working on an assignment-based project topic. A committee of students assists the NUCS, Hyderabad in arranging for their summer internship. At the end of the summer internship, students are required to submit a report and make a presentation to the faculty assigned

## **PEDAGOGY**

NUCS believes that the method of instruction to maximise learning varies from course-to-course, and therefore, uses a host of pedagogical approaches in different courses such as case studies, lectures, group and individual exercises, class projects and simulation of business environment to enrich the overall programme delivery. Site visits are organised as and when required. The curriculum of MBA APM comprises course work, practical's /tutorials, summer internship, self-work and project work.

## **ASSESSMENT**

### **i. Course Examination**

The course examination comprises two parts: Semester end examination and Internal assessment.

The weightage for the same is given below.

The semester end examination carries 60 marks, and is of two hours duration. The

examination may have the following components:

- a. Essay type questions.
- b. Structured or short answer questions.
- c. Questions involving computations and derivations.
- d. Case analysis

## **ii. Internal Assessment**

Internal Assessment is done on a continuous basis by the instructors. Internal assessment can be based on one or more of the following: (a) Case Analysis and presentation, (b) an assignment (c) presentation on a selected and relevant topic and (d) quiz based on multiple choice questions.

presentation on a selected and relevant topic and (d) quiz based on multiple choice questions.

## **iii. Workshops**

Managerial skills workshop is a Mandatory Non-Graded (MNG) course. The workshop includes group discussions, role plays, presentation and assignment. Different software such as MSP, Primavera, @Risk etc. will be taught in the computer labs.

## **iv. Summer internship and project work**

Summer internship is assessed by the internal faculty only. Summer internship carries 50 marks and is assessed during the third semester. The weightage assigned is 50% each for report writing and presentation.

Students' project work i.e. project seminar is evaluated by the assigned guide and an internal faculty (this is done at the end of the third semester). The final viva voce is evaluated by the guide and an expert from industry or faculty members from other institutes at the end of fourth semester. The seminar is of 50 marks whereas final viva voce is of 100 marks. In project seminar, weightage for contents is 60% and for presentation 40% whereas in case of viva voce, 80% weightage is for the content and 20% weightage is for the presentation.

## **v. Failure Cases**

NUCS's programmes are highly demanding to which students of a high calibre are admitted through a rigorous evaluation process. It is therefore expected that no student fails in any subject or delay submission of their project work without valid reasons. Students unable to score 40% marks in internal and semester end examinations together in a course will be declared failed in that course.

However, if any student fails to obtain the minimum passing marks in any subject, their overall result will be withheld. Such a student will have to re-appear for examination by paying the re-examination fee of Rs. 2000/- per subject in the next semester and obtain the minimum passing marks, so as to qualify in the course.

Similarly, non-submission of project work on time is not acceptable. A candidate is not considered to have completed the programme unless they submit the project report and is judged as satisfactory by the guide and given ratings by the examiner/s appointed for the purpose.

If the students wish to get their examination paper/s re-evaluated, then this can be done on payment of re-evaluation fees of Rs. 1000/- per paper.

## **vi. Grading System**

Evaluation will be done on a semester basis. At the end of every semester, a Semester Performance Index (SPI) and Cumulative Performance Index (CPI) will be calculated. Students should clear all courses for meeting the requirements of the programme.
